we took the opportunity to build a future."

Hu's parents opened Soldotna's Golden International restaurant in 1981. Today, Hu's wife Sharon runs the business but still receives help from her mostlyretired in-laws.

Growing up in the Soldotna community, Hu found it easy to express himself and his passions through the arts. He participated in band and drama, which helped him grow comfortable in front of a crowd. But it wasn't until a junior-high class took a field trip to a local dentist that Hu became hooked on his future profession.

"It was a career day sort of thing," Hu said. "When the doctor told me dentistry has a little bit of everything, it's architecture, it's art, it's science, I knew it was the field for me.

"Throw in helping to improve people's lives and it only made more sense."

Well studied, well educated

Hu's healthy appetite for dentistry served him well as a student before and after he graduated high school in 1991. He earned numerous local, state and national scholarships on the way to being admitted to the University of Michigan's prestigious dualdegree dental program known as the "Preferred Admissions Program."The school's dental program is considered by many as the best in the world.

By the time Hu turned 24, he earned his bachelor's and doctorate. He returned to Alaska in 1998 and took over a well-known Soldotna practice. Since then, his well-crafted work in dental sleep medicine, cosmetic dentistry and dental implants has resulted in credentialed memberships in many national and international dental academies and societies. In May 2017, he obtained his second board certification as a Diplomate with the American Sleep and Breathing Academy thus strengthening his expertise. He's also spoken at national and international conferences.

"Doing so always takes me back to those days in drama class and performing in the band," Hu said. "I'm so appreciative of everything my Alaska teachers taught me."

Hu and his team redesigned his Soldotna practice in 2002 using the same feng shui principles reflecting nature, peace and tranquility he used when building the Anchorage practice.

"Whether in the waiting room or the dental chairs, we always want our patients to be comfortable," he said.

Comfort lends itself to Hu and his working relationship with Weimer and First National. The bank helped Hu work with the Small Business Administration to find the exact kind of financing he desired in building the Anchorage practice.

TRUST FIRST NATIONAL'S BANKING EXPERTS TO KNOW YOUR FINANCING OPTIONS

When Dr. Jerry Hu started thinking about designing and building his new practice in south Anchorage, the Soldotna-based dentist didn't hesitate. He insisted on discussing his financing options with First National Bank Alaska Senior Vice President Charlie Weimer.

"Charlie knows my personality so well because he's known me so long," Hu said. "I've never been a big fan of carrying interest on a loan if it wasn't necessary. If I had choices, I knew Charlie and First National would spell them out for me."

Weimer described to Hu the Small Business Administration's (SBA) 504 loan program. It is designed to provide financing for the purchase of fixed assets, which usually means real estate, buildings or machinery, at below-market rates.

The 504 program consists of three parts. The business owner contributes a minimum of 10 percent with a traditional lender like First National providing 50 percent. A certified development company (CDC), in this case Evergreen Business Capital, finances the remaining costs.

The program allows the business owner to retain more working capital to grow the business.

"I still like to joke with Charlie about there being a lot more paperwork to fill out than I expected," Hu said. "But the long-term benefits proved to be quite awesome."


When it's time to expand your business, start by breaking down your business plan with a First National banking expert. You'll learn about loan options available to help your company grow. Some examples include:

- Electronic Health Records (EHR) financing - Custom options help healthcare providers convert from paper to digital health records.
- **Equipment and vehicle loans** Keep your competitive edge with an equipment loan to purchase computers, vehicles, heavy equipment or other machinery. Repayment terms are dependent upon type and age of collateral.
- **Inventory financing** Whether you need inventory for growth or must meet seasonal demands, this loan will help you keep plenty of stock on hand. Inventory financing is also convenient for businesses in remote locations. Pay off the loan through the sale of financed goods. Collateral is usually the inventory financed, though additional collateral may be required.
- Letters of credit Documentary and stand -by letters of credit are arrangements often used by import/export business, contractors and travel agencies to serve as assurance of payment. Documentary letters of credit are usually for fewer than six months. A stand-by letter of credit may be renewed annually.
- **Revolving line of credit** Meet working capital needs or bonding requirements without having to go through the application process each time with a revolving line of credit. Collateral and repayment terms are established on an annual basis and tailored to your needs.

Hu's new clinic in south Anchorage came about through a partnership between First National, Evergreen Business Capital and the Small Business Administration via the SBA 504 program. The program offers 10-percent down, low-rate, long-term financing for real estate or equipment purchases.
